REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION TO THE PROFESSIONAL PHASE OF THE PROGRAM

The Professional Phase indicates “preparedness” for upper level coursework.

1. Completion of a minimum of **45 CREDIT HOURS** of degree plan coursework, 30 of which must be University Core Curriculum Requirements with a minimum of 15 hours completed at TAMU.
2. Complete the following courses with a grade of “C” or better:

ENGL 104	BIOL 107	HLTH 210	HEFB 222
MATH 141 or 166	CHEM 101&111	HLTH 231	
3. Minimum GPR Requirements:
 - a. The state requires a minimum GPA of 2.75 for admission to upper-level teacher certification. The GPA of 2.75 will be configured from all coursework taken at ANY institution of Higher Education.

NOTICE: Students will need to ensure that all coursework taken from other institutions has been provided to Texas A&M University and/or their academic advisor. If not, this can affect their admission into professional phase.
 - b. Once admitted into upper-level coursework students must maintain a minimum GPA of 2.5 or higher (as specified by program). Check with your advisor for program specific requirements.
4. Submit online application form on the CEHD Portal:
 - a. The online **Professional Phase Application** is available online: <https://myrecord.cehd.tamu.edu/hlknapps/teedadmission/>. The online form consists of the following:
 - i. Professional Phase Application
 - ii. Application for Student Teaching
 - iii. Degree Plan Spreadsheet
 - iv. Meet with Program Coordinator, prior to application deadline, to discuss Professional Behavior Form.
 - b. You are eligible to apply to professional phase once enrolled in your last bolded course.
 - c. Submission of applications must occur by the required deadline. Due dates are determined each semester and will be sent out by email from your advisor.
 - d. Students will be reviewed for admission to Professional Phase the semester following the deadline date.
 - e. Reviews will occur three times per year according to the deadlines each semester in the Fall, Spring, and Summer.

Late applications will not be accepted and students must resubmit to the next acceptance date. If your application gets denied following a failing grade with a bolded course, your application will be cancelled and student will need to resubmit the following semester.

Registration will NOT be permitted for Professional Program courses until your official acceptance.

NOTE: Approximately 3 weeks after the deadline you will be able to check <https://howdy.tamu.edu> to see that your status has been changed from Health (Lower) to HLTH-School Health Educ. This will allow you to register for professional phase courses. You will receive official notification of your acceptance or denial to the professional phase of the program approximately two weeks after TAMU grades are posted for the semester.

Professional Phase Acceptance Reviews

1. A faculty committee will review all applications immediately after each deadline date. Applicants will be notified by e-mail

- sent to individual's TAMU email address approximately three weeks after review.
- Criteria for acceptance includes pre-requisite courses' GPR, overall GPR, & pre-portfolio review.
 - Entrance to professional phase is a COMPETITIVE process.** Only 40 students will be admitted per year (10 for Summer, 15 for Fall, and 15 for Spring).
 - In the event of ties, HLTH 231 grade and number of Q-drops recorded will serve as tiebreakers.

Differential Tuition:

Undergraduate students enrolled in the professional phase of teacher preparation programs **incur a differential tuition charge of ~\$300 in each of the semesters with field-based coursework**. This differential tuition helps support field experiences, supervision, scholarships and international/urban experiences in culturally diverse settings.

REQUIREMENTS FOR STUDENT TEACHING

- Submit an **Intent to Graduate** form to your academic advisor *one year prior* to student teaching. Deadlines will be sent out in an email during the Spring and Fall semesters.
- Minimum 2.5 GPR requirements on all A&M coursework.**
- If ENGL 104 has been completed with a grade of "C", then COMM 203 must have a grade of "B". The grade combination of "B/C" is required for ENGL 104 and COMM 203.
- Complete the following courses (including courses transferred to TAMU) with a "C" or better: Science Foundation; Professional Development; Major (HLTH & KINE)
- Successful completion of *Exit Interview/Portfolio Presentation*. Must be complete in its entirety prior to Q-drop date of the semester enrolled in the Pre-Student Teaching Course (HLTH 415).
- Student Teaching Placement** is coordinated during HLTH 415. HLKN will place students in approved placement areas consisting of: Austin, Dallas, Houston, San Antonio, Central Texas, & East Texas. Local placements will only be considered for highly extenuating circumstances (lease contracts will not be considered). Local placement is defined as a 40-mile radius to include Brenham, Navasota, Caldwell, & other surrounding areas.

NOTE: ALL COURSEWORK MUST BE COMPLETED BEFORE STUDENTS WILL BE PERMITTED TO STUDENT TEACH

REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION

- Successfully complete ALL degree plan courses with required grade in each.
- Successfully complete ALL core curriculum requirements.
- Add/Pay diploma fee the semester you graduate.
- Apply for graduation the semester you graduate.
- Transfer all applicable courses to A&M'S Admission's Office.

HLTH 216

Students must have two hours not being utilized in any other requirement to sub for the HLTH 216 waiver. Students are not allowed to take the HLTH 216 Weekend Waiver course during their final semester at TAMU. Students will have to register for the HLTH 216 course if this occurs.

Undergraduate Degree Planner Requirement

All students entering Texas A&M University in fall 2013 or later are required by TEC§51.9685 (formerly House Bill 3025) to complete an online undergraduate degree plan. Students are required to complete the Undergraduate Degree Planner before the start date of their second year. The Undergraduate Degree Planner is in Howdy on the My Record tab in the Undergraduate Degree Planner channel. Guides for using the Undergraduate Degree Planner are also available in Howdy.

Progress Towards Degree

Students must show progress towards their degree by completing a combined total of 24 credit hours on their degree plan during the fall and spring semesters. At the end of the spring semester, students who did not complete 24 credit hours on their degree plan will be placed on probation. They must complete at least 12 hours on their degree plan plus make up any additional hours not completed the year before during the next fall semester. Failure to do so will result in dismissal from the department.

Preliminary Criminal History Evaluation for Educator Certification Candidates

Texas Education Agency offers a *Preliminary Criminal History Evaluation Educator Certification Candidates* for a **non-refundable fee of \$50.00**. This *optional* service will allow those individuals who are contemplating obtaining a Texas Teacher Certificate in the future, the opportunity to have a review of an existing criminal history performed by agency staff. The review will be based solely on information provided by the candidate and will result in a non-binding opinion issued by the agency as to whether or not the candidate would be eligible for Texas Teacher Certification at the time of the evaluation. This process does not preclude a candidate from being required to submit to a national criminal history review as required by statute at the time of application for educator credentials. This degree plan has been laid out showing students the number of hours they must take each semester in order to complete the degree in four years without attending summer school. This is a suggested plan and does not have to be followed as laid out below. Students should use this document in conjunction with the flow chart, curriculum spreadsheet and degree plan when scheduling courses each semester to ensure that they are meeting all prerequisites, taking courses for admission to professional phase in a timely manner and meeting all grade requirements.

If a student plans to student teach in the Fall, their last semester of taking coursework falls on the Summer prior.

Health Education Certification Portfolio Requirement Guidelines

- **Each student will complete a total of 100 independent hours of field-based experiences**
- These experiences are NOT to come from required coursework hours or required course experiences.
- Students without a coaching minor will complete 25 hours of direct student contact in place of the coaching experience. Coaching will serve as direct student contact for coaching minors.

All field-based experiences must include at least 25 hours from each of the three (3) areas below. The other 25 required hours may be counted towards any area:

COMMUNITY-BASED PROGRAMS (Not Coaching)

25 hours minimum: At least 5 hours in elementary*/5 hours in secondary**

- Boys and Girls Club
- Camp Counselor
- TEEN EXIT Center
- Scouts
- Community Education Literacy or Math programs (HOSTS)
- Other Community-based programs with approval of KNFB 322 instructor
- Big Brother/Sister
- Juvenile Courts
- Community Centers

SCHOOL- BASED PROGRAMS (Not Coaching)

25 hours minimum: At least 5 hours in elementary*/5 hours in secondary**

- These hours must come from observing/volunteering in a classroom either in a public or private school
 - Minimum of 5 hours are to be volunteer (classroom aid, event facilitator, fund-raising events, VIPS)

DIRECT STUDENT CONTACT (Non-coaching minors)

25 hours minimum: At least 5 hours in elementary*/5 hours in secondary**

- These hours must come from direct interaction with students individually or as a small group (individual tutoring, reading to students, HOSTS, substitute teaching, classroom aid).

COACHING: (substitutes for direct student contact - coaching minor only)

25 hours minimum: At least 5 hours in elementary*/5 hours in secondary**

- School-based classroom (PE) observation
- Community-based programs (Kids Klub, Boys and Girls club)
- Coaching (school or community based)

>>> *Elementary = Pre-K – 6

**Secondary = 7th -12th <<<

PORTFOLIO and ADMISSION to PROFESSIONAL PHASE:

- Successful (C or better) completion of HEFB 222
- Students must maintain a separate log of all their independent experiences that lists the date, number of hours, area of experience, level (secondary or elementary), location, contact person (name, phone, & email), and the signature of the person"

FINAL PORTFOLIO REVIEW/DEFENSE:

- **Total Hours:** Must be completed in its entirety (100 hours).
- **Portfolio includes:**
 - Introduction, professional photo, and email address.
 - Philosophy of Education
 - Experiences: descriptions of the three experiences student had with direct student contact, community and school based programs.
 - Artifacts from each teacher certification course should be included
 - Standards: Artifacts supporting each program standard.
 - Self-assessment (What have you learned in the process, and what you still need to learn)
 - Resume (To be used in job application)
- **DEADLINE:** Must set up the review/defense date prior to Q-drop of the semester enrolled in HLTH 415.
- **Student teaching placement** dependent upon completion of the final portfolio review/defense.
