I. REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION TO THE PROFESSIONAL PHASE OF THE PROGRAM

The Professional Phase indicates “preparedness” for upper level coursework.

1. Complete ENGL 104 & COMM 203 with a minimum “B/C” grade combination.
2. Complete the following courses with a grade of “C” or better:

BIOL 111	MATH 141/166	BIOL 319	HLTH 210	
CHEM 101/111	HEFB 322	BIOL 320	HLTH 231	HLTH 332
3. Minimum GPR Requirements:
 - a. 2.50 Overall A&M GPR.
 - b. 2.50 A&M Degree Plan GPR.
 - c. 2.50 in ALL Teaching Fields
4. Submit application form available on the web site, <http://hlknweb.tamu.edu/articles/forms>. Submission of applications must occur by the required deadline. Students will be reviewed for admission to Professional Phase the semester following the deadline date. Reviews will occur three times per year according to the following deadline dates:
 - a. Summer Acceptance – March 1
 - b. Fall Acceptance – June 15
 - c. Spring Acceptance – October 1Applications must be complete and accurate prior to being turned into the HLKN Advising Office. Incomplete and handwritten applications will be returned unprocessed. Late applications will not be accepted and students must resubmit to the next acceptance date.
5. Submit Professional Phase Application, Application for Student Teaching, and Professional Phase Checklist. These forms are available on the web site, <http://hlknweb.tamu.edu/articles/forms>.
6. Submit Degree Plan Spreadsheet via email to Health All-Level Teacher Certification advisor and a paper copy to the HLKN Advising Office
7. Meet with the Program Coordinator to discuss the Code of Ethics and Expectations for Professional Behavior Forms. Submit signed forms with application.
8. Successful completion of the English Language Learner (ELL) module. Module link can be found on the HLKN website.

NOTE: Approximately 3 weeks after the deadline you will be able to check <https://howdy.tamu.edu> to see that your status has been changed from Health (Lower) to HLTH-School Health Educ. This will allow you to register for professional phase courses. You will receive official notification of your acceptance or denial to the professional phase of the program approximately two weeks after TAMU grades are posted for the semester.

II. REQUIREMENTS FOR STUDENT TEACHING

1. Minimum GPR requirements on all A&M coursework:
 - a. 2.50 Overall
 - b. 2.50 on Degree Plan coursework
 - c. 2.50 in each category: Professional Development, and Major (HLTH & KINE).
2. Complete the following courses (including courses transferred to TAMU) with a “C” or better: Science Foundation; Professional Development; Major (HLTH & KINE)
3. Successful completion of *Exit Interview/Portfolio Presentation*. Must be complete in its entirety prior to Q-drop date of the semester enrolled in the Pre-Student Teaching Course (HLTH 415).

III. REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADUATION

1. Successfully complete ALL degree plan courses with required grade in each.
2. Successfully complete ALL core curriculum requirements.
3. Add/Pay diploma fee the semester you graduate.
4. Apply for graduation the semester you graduate.
5. Transfer all applicable courses to A&M’S Records Office.

IV. Progress Towards Degree- Students must show progress towards their degree by completing a combined total of 24 credit hours on their degree plan during the fall and spring semesters. At the end of the spring semester, students who did not complete 24 credit hours on their degree plan will be placed on probation. They must complete at least 12 hours on their degree plan plus make up any additional hours not completed the year before during the next fall semester. Failure to do so will result in dismissal from the department.

V. HLTH 216

Students are not allowed to take the HLTH 216 Weekend Waiver course during their final semester at TAMU. Students will have to register for the HLTH 216 course if this occurs. Students must have two hours not being utilized in any other requirement to sub for the HLTH 216 waiver.
